

# Pathways 2012 Jr Camp

## THINGS TO BRING

On a typical camp day, you will be dressed in jeans or shorts, T-shirt, athletic socks, and tennis shoes. Campers will not have access to laundry facilities. We will provide **2 Camp T-shirts**, but you will need shirts for the rest of the week. We recommend that you use a laundry marker to mark all clothing and personal belongings before coming to camp. Please bring only one suitcase, a sleeping bag and a pillow, as storage is limited.

### Clothing List

- 5-6 pairs of shorts
- 4-5 short-sleeved tops
- 2 pairs of long pants
- 2 long-sleeved shirts or sweatshirts
- Sleepwear
- 7-8 sets of underwear
- 1 or 2 Swimsuits (**one-piece swimsuits**)
- Cover-up or T-shirt
- 2 pair of athletic shoes (in case one gets wet or muddy)
- 7-8 pairs of white athletic socks
- 1 light rain jacket/parka
- One set of older clothes for special activities
- Hat for sun protection
- Shower shoes or flip flops

### Sleeping gear & Towels

- One sleeping bag/blankets (cots are provided, but no bedding)
- Pillow (if desired, none are provided)
- 2-3 towels and washcloths, including swimming towel

### Personal Items

- Bible
- Backpack or tote bag for carrying water bottle and towels around camp and items to bathhouse
- Plastic garbage bags for dirty laundry
- Toiletries - hairbrush, comb, toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, soap, shampoo, etc.
- Sunglasses and sunscreen
- Insect repellent
- Flashlight with NEW batteries
- Medication (if needed - will be collected and administered by Camp Nurse)
- Camera and film (optional - recommend disposable with your name on it)
- 4-5 plastic hangars to hang things to dry
- Small, personal sized battery operated fan with extra batteries (Optional)
- Snack foods and bottled water (1 per day - strongly recommended or a refillable water bottle)

**\*\*Please note:** Campers are allowed to eat their own snacks during rest periods in the dorms. Healthy choices such as granola bars, applesauce or nuts are recommended.

### Do NOT Bring:

- Valuables such as expensive jewelry, watches or rings, excessive money
- Handheld games, portable radios/CD/DVD/cassette players or any other electronic device
- Cell phones
